Assessment, Care Planning and Documentation Procedures

- Identify and document care interventions to address care needs.
- Set measurable clinical goals to determine the effectiveness of the care interventions.
- Work closely with all members of the multidisciplinary team in the development of care plans.
- Ensure that all care plans are completed

within 28 days of a resident's admission.
